## 2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Dan Saylor made a motion for approval and Buzzy Newman seconded the motion; motion carried.

## 3. OLD BUSINESS

#### **City of Evansville**

- Walnut St Phase 2 (Weinbach Ave to Vann Ave): The project was let for bid on January 12, 2022. None of the bids received were below the engineers estimate.
- Walnut St Phase 3 (MLK Jr Blvd to US 41): Final environmental document has been approved. Right of way APAs (Appraisal Problem Analysis) are underway. Utility work plans have been requested.
- <u>Signal Head Replacement:</u> Construction was awarded to Ragle, Inc. for the low bid of \$220,952.75.

## **Vanderburgh County**

- <u>Franklin St Bridge:</u> The project was let for bid on December 8, 2021 and has been awarded to Ragle, Inc. for the low bid of \$2,507,001.78. Local match for construction has been processed.
- Oak Hill Rd (Eastwood Dr to Millersburg Rd): The county commissioners approved right of way offer amounts for 23 parcels.
- Oak Hill Rd (Lynch Rd to St George Rd): A preliminary field check was held on December 9, 2021.

## **Warrick County**

- <u>Bell Rd:</u> Project is complete and open to traffic.
- Warrick Trails SRTS: Project is complete and open for use.
- Telephone Rd: A public meeting has been set for February 1, 2022.

#### **City/County of Henderson**

• Wathen Lane: Right of way and utility work is underway.

## **KYTC**

• Watson Lane: Title research has started for the right of way process.

### **INDOT Updates – presented by Rusty Fowler, INDOT**

- (B-42876) US 41 Pedestrian Walk at Washington Ave: Working on Stage 2 design and right of way engineering. Finalizing environmental document to start looking at scheduling the public hearing.
- (R-41410) US 41 from N of SR 66/SR 62 (Lloyd Expwy) to N of SR 66 (Diamond Ave): Preliminary Field Check was held on November 2, 2021. Will need additional funding. Working to summarize the drainage improvements and tree clearing need.
- (R-37845) US 41 at Hillsdale Rd: Project moved to the November 15, 2023 letting. Right of way process with railroad has met delays.
- (R-42287) SR 62 from Rosenberger Ave to Wabash Ave; US 41 over SR 66/Diamond (including various intersections improvements from Rosenberger Ave to Cross Pointe Blvd): Completed final review of videos to be shared in February. Stage 1 design is complete for Burkhardt, Vann, Cross Pointe and pavement replacement from Wabash to Rosenberger. Bridge design has started. Environmental work underway.

Rusty Fowler provided an update to the Pigeon Creek Bridge on US 41. Northbound work has stopped for winter and both lanes are open. Northbound was completed north of Pigeon Creek, with work needing to be complete on the northbound side south of Pigeon Creek and the ramps at Diamond Ave. Work is still ongoing on the southbound side of the bridge. Work on the northbound side will start again in the spring.

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Rusty Fowler also provided an update to the high-mast lighting project at US 41 and I 69. Work will continue through the winter and spring.

This item was informational and did not require a committee action.


#### 4. NEW BUSINESS

#### a. METS and EMPO Agreement of Services for Transit Admin – presented by Kari Akin

The Evansville MPO requests approval of the agreement for services to assist METS with grants and financial reporting for their grants for CY 2022. Compensation will be for \$45,600 in local funds. Legal services have reviewed the document and BPW approved the METS signatures on December 23, 2021.

Buzzy Newman made a motion for approval and Christy Powell seconded the motion; motion carried.

#### b. FY 2022-2026 TIP Amendments – presented by Pam Drach

## c. TIP Modifications – presented by Pam Drach

The Evansville Metropolitan Planning Organization processed the following administrative modification to the FY 2022-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) on December 20, 2021:

ID# 02-711: KY 2084 intersection with KY 812: add dedicated right and left turn lanes and signal updates. Revise FY 2022 Construction (CN) from \$950,000 to \$1,360,000 to be funded using 80% Federal SHN funds and a 20% state match.

This item was informational and did not require a committee action.

The Carver Community Organization was added under Medical and Medicaid transportation.
