## 4. OLD BUSINESS

## a. Project Update - presented by Pam Drach

#### **City of Evansville**

• Walnut St Phase 2 (Weinbach Ave to Vann Ave): Scheduled for relet on April 6, 2022.

Nate Hahn asked what changes were made to the project before it was sent out for bid again. Pam Drach explained that they typically review feedback from contractors and believes in this case there were some cost differences in the system for piping. No design adjustments were made that we are aware of. Matthew Bullock

• <u>Signal Head Replacement:</u> Eight intersections are complete; four intersections remaining.

## Vanderburgh County

- <u>Franklin St Bridge:</u> Clearing activities to be completed by March 31. Bridge work not expected to begin until April.
- Oak Hill Rd (Eastwood Dr to Millersburg Rd): Utility coordination is continuing. Plan revisions are being made where possible to help avoid relocations or improve the constructability.
  - Mychelle Christian asked what complete street components will be added? Pam Drach believes that the county's intent is to continue the cross-section that is south of Lynch Rd through this phase, but will confirm with the county and follow up with Mychelle via email.
- Oak Hill Rd (Lynch Rd to St George Rd): Working on addressing the comments from the PFC meeting.

# **Warrick County**

- <u>Telephone Rd:</u> The public meeting was held February1, 2022. The final environmental document was submitted to INDOT for approval.
- Epworth Rd: Consultant contract negotiations for preliminary engineering is underway.

#### City/County of Henderson

- Green River Rd: The right of way phase is underway.
- <u>Wathen Lane:</u> NOPA (notice of proposed acquisition) letters on City letterhead have been sent out to affected parcel owners. Appraisals are being completed.

#### **KYTC**

- <u>KY 2084 at KY 812/Airline Rd:</u> Project let for bid in January 2022 and was awarded to Ragle Inc for a total of \$1,063,785.88.
- <u>KY 2183 and KY 1539:</u> The City and County are reviewing the project purpose, need, benefits and costs to identify a preferred alternative.

## **INDOT Updates – presented by Matthew Bullock, INDOT**

- (B-43148) US 41 Bridge over Pigeon Creek: Currently working on bridge piers. SB 41 will down to one lane on March 22, 2022. Bridge will need to be completed before northbound lanes can be completed.
- (R-39921) US 66 at Epworth Rd: Project moved to August 10, 2022 letting. Public hearing was scheduled for March 9, 2022.
  - Greg Wathen asked if there were any negative comments received during the public hearing. Matthew Bullock said that he hasn't heard of anything yet. Jeff Whitaker said that he was at the meeting and he didn't hear anyone make any really negative comments; he thought the meeting went really well.
- (B-42725) SR 62 over Barker Ave: Project moved to June 15, 2022 letting. Contract files have been sent to Central Office for advertising.
- (R-40551) SR 62 (various locations between SR 61 and the West Jct SR 161): Letting moved to June 15, 2022 due to needing additional funding and right-of-way time. Utility coordination causing delay. Have meeting with utilities on March 4, 2022. Will readdress after meeting.
- (R-37845) US 41 at Hillsdale Rd: Received signed Shared Use Agreement with CSX Railroad. Project is likely to be bundled with structure replacement to the south B-42185.
- (B-42185) US 41 1.80 mi N Jct SR 57): Working through Maintenance of Traffic options, crossover likely in order to construct with Hillsdale median U-Turn R-37845.
- (R-42287) SR 62 from Rosenberger Ave to Wabash Ave; US 41 over SR 66/Diamond (including various intersections improvements from Rosenberger Ave to Cross Pointe Blvd): Preliminary Field Check for eastside

intersections scheduled for March 9, 2022 and westside projects for March 30, 2022. A public meeting is scheduled for March 29, 2022 in person and a virtual meeting is scheduled for March 31, 2022.

### c. 2022 Transit Targets (TAM & PTASP) – presented by Matt Schriefer

METS and HART have been required to develop annual Transit Asset Management (TAM) Targets since completion of the Group TAM Plan in September 2018. At the end of each year, the MPO gathers fleet data from METS and HART to calculate the end of the previous year Performance Metrics and set the end of the current year Targets. Although not required, the MPO also calculates Performance Metrics and sets Targets for the non-profit vehicles. With your approval of these Targets, the MPO will include them in the TIP and MTP documents. The table below includes TAM Performance Measures definitions, end of 2021 Performance Metrics, and end of 2022 TAM Targets.

Starting in 2021, METS and HART are also required to develop annual Safety Targets. These Targets are listed in the recently completed Public Transit Agency Safety Plans (PTASP) for both METS and HART. The MPO worked with METS and HART to collect safety data to calculate Performance Metrics and set Targets. With your approval of these Targets, the MPO will include them in the TIP and MTP documents. The table below includes Safety Performance Measure definitions, end of 2020 Performance Metrics, and end of 2022 Safety Targets.

Thomas Witt noted that the 2021 and 2022 Rolling Stock buses for HART were "n/a", so he asked if they didn't have any vehicles that fall under that category. Matt Schriefer explained that per the FTA guidelines Rolling Stock Buses are the larger 30'-35' buses. Rolling Stock Cutaways are considered to be the E450 or F450 vehicles with a body on the back of the chassis. HART only has cutaway buses in their fleet.

Shawn Hayden made a motion for approval and Lorie Van Hook seconded the motion; motion carried.

## d. 2022 Title VI Goals & Accomplishments Report – presented by Matt Schriefer

At the beginning of each year, the Evansville MPO develops a list of Title VI accomplishments from the prior year and Title VI goals for the upcoming year. These goals and accomplishments include completed and upcoming trainings and workshops, updates to the Title VI documents and surveys, and the total number of Title VI complaints from the previous year.

#### e. 2022 MPO Section 5310 Grant Public Hearing – presented by Matt Schriefer

Public Notice of the 2022 MPO Section 5310 grant application for FTA funding for non-profits was placed in the Evansville Courier & Press on March 1, 2022. The Notice provided an opportunity for the public to review, comment, and ask questions about the grant application, as well as be notified of the public hearing to be held at the MPO Technical and Policy Committee meetings on March 10, 2022. Public comments will be accepted through March 18, 2022.

If the MPO receives comments, the application will be reviewed and revised as needed. If no comments are heard, the grant application will be submitted with the funding amounts listed in the program of projects.

Thomas Witt asked about Chemo Buddies being listed in the public hearing notice, but not included in the program of projects. Matt Schriefer explained that the Section 5310 program is a reimbursement program at 50%, and because Chemo Buddies relies and operates on donations, spending the money upfront and waiting for reimbursement was going to be a challenge for them and they decided to not pursue the 5310 funding.



## **Approval Requested:**

The Evansville Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) has completed an update to the *Section 5310: Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program Management Plan* (PMP). The PMP identifies the policies and procedures the MPO follows to administer the Federal Transit Administration's (FTA) Section 5310: Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities grant program. It also identifies the requirements the subrecipients must follow in order to be eligible for Section 5310 funding.

Changes since the last PMP, which was adopted in 2018, include:

- Regional Transit Advisory Committee (RTAC)
  - The RTAC was established after adoption of the previous PMP. This update includes the role the RTAC plays in the Section 5310 program.
- Operating funds as an eligible activity
  - O Previously, the MPO only provided Section 5310 funds for capital expenses, primarily the acquisition of accessible minivans or buses for non-profit agencies. Per Section 5310 regulations, up to 35% of our region's available Section 5310 funding can be used for operating. Moving forward, the MPO will utilized up to 35% of funds for operating expenses for non-profit agencies, pending the number of vehicles requested.
- On-site visits to the non-profit transportation providers.
  - The MPO is increasing their oversight of Section 5310 subrecipients moving forward. This update includes an on-site visit checklist that the MPO will now use to evaluate the non-profit agencies that provide transportation.
