2. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Shawn Hayden made a motion for approval and Matthew Bullock seconded the motion; motion carried.

3. OLD BUSINESS

a. Project Update – presented by Pam Drach

City of Evansville

- <u>Walnut St Phase 2 (Weinbach Ave to Vann Ave)</u>: From Weinbach to Boeke, the roadway has been restored to the intermediate course. Construction of the multi-use path continues. Traffic is allowed in from Boeke and several north-south side sideroads have been opened to accommodate residential traffic. From Boeke to Vann, staggered barricades have been placed to reduce through traffic movements. Waterline extension will begin soon along the corridor.
- <u>Walnut St Phase 3 (MLK Jr Blvd to US 41)</u>: Right of way acquisition is complete and the project is ready for letting.

Vanderburgh County

• Franklin St Bridge (over Pigeon Creek): Construction was completed in December 2022.

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- <u>Oak Hill Rd (Eastwood Dr to Millersburg Rd)</u>: Right of way activities are continuing with 37 of 48 parcels secured. Permit applications have been submitted.
- <u>Oak Hill Rd (Lynch Rd to St George Rd)</u>: Field work for wetland delineation and archeology sampling is complete. Right of way engineering is underway. Consultant is working on Stage 2 plans and utility coordination.

INDOT Updates – presented by Matthew Bullock, INDOT

- (B-42643) I-69 Over Baseline Rd: Pre-Con was held on October 13, 2022, and the final acceptance was sent out on December 7, 2022.
- (R-40567) SR 65 over I-64 EB/WB Lanes: Contract was awarded to Blankenberger Brothers for \$12,923,950.
- (B-42718) SR 66 over Locust Creek/Pigeon Creek: Project has been awarded to Ram Construction.
- (R-41160) SR 68 from SR 161 to US 231: Project was awarded to JH Rudolph.
- (B-39418) SR 68 over Simpson Branch: Project has been pushed from a November 2022 to a January 2023 letting date due to utility issues.
- (B-44156) US 41 over SR 66/Diamond Ave: Project is posted on the January 19th letting and have received several contractor questions.
- (R-39921) SR 66 at Epworth Rd: Project files have been sent to Central Office to be advertised for the February 2023 letting.
- (R-39421) US 66 (between New Harmony Rd and Detroy Rd): Project is ready to be posted for the February 2023 letting.
- (B-39367) I-64 over Plum Creek: Received all permits, project is ready to be posted on the March 2023 letting.
- (R-42753) Various locations in the Vincennes District, including I-69 and SR 57: Project moved to the April 2023 letting. Environmental CE-3 was submitted for review. Will post public notice near the end of January.
- (B-42876) US 41 Pedestrian Walk at Washington Ave: Environmental complete. RW is in buying and working through getting utility relocations started.
- (R-41410) US 41 (SR 66/SR 62 to SR 66 (Diamond)): RW is working through the buying and condemnation process.
- (R-37845) US 41 at Hillsdale Rd: Project was bundled. Awaiting fees from Burgess & Niple to complete design of the structures. Working on Shared Use Agreement with CSX.
- <u>(R-42287) Lloyd4U project:</u> Working on Stage 2 design. Also working on environmental and utility coordination. RW Engineering complete and starting the acquisition process.
- (B-43235) SR 68 over Mill Creek: Received Waters Report, working on Permit Determination.

Nate Hahn commented that the welcome center on I-69 was an interesting project and asked if it is something that has been planned for a while because of I-69. He asked if it was recommended by the state, and Pam said that is was recommended from INDOT's Central Office. Shawn Hayden asked where the welcome center will be on I-69. Pam said that that is part of what this funding is for, to begin a study and determine the location.

Matthew Bullock made a motion for approval and Shawn Hayden seconded the motion; motion carried.

c. Transportation Air Quality Conformity Protocol – presented by Pam Drach

The Evansville MPO is seeking approval of the interagency consultation group Transportation Air Quality Conformity Protocol. The protocol outlines the process for determining the conformity of the Metropolitan Transportation Plan and Transportation Improvement Program with state and federal air quality plans and procedures.

Nate Hahn asked if this came from something else or if this is something that the MPO developed. Pam explained that it was developed in conjunction with other agencies and it ultimately gets approved by Federal Highway. Thomas Witt asked what major changes there were from the previous document. Pam explained that there aren't major changes; there

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were clarifications about timelines. The actual protocol was developed by Federal Highway, Indiana Department of Environmental Management, and US Environmental Protection Agency and provided to us for approval. Thomas also commented that Kentucky wasn't included on the agreement and asked if this was because Henderson doesn't have an air quality issue. Pam confirmed that is the case.

John Petkovsek made a motion for approval and Matthew Bullock seconded the motion; motion carried.

5. OTHER BUSINESS

Erin Schriefer provided an update on the long-range transportation plan and conformity determination. The MTP is the long-range transportation plan for the region that identifies regionally significant transportation projects. A link will be sent out in the next week for you to review the draft plan online. A 30-day public comment period will begin on January 25th and be open through February 24th. There will also be public open house events in February. Information on these events will also be provided in the email with the link to the plan.

Pam Drach provided an update on the 2024-2028 Transportation Improvement Program. The two-year TIP cycle coincides with the MTP 2050 update and conformity determination. Pam will send out the draft TIP project listing that was developed in coordination with state DOTs, LPAs, transit agencies and non-profit organizations. At this time, the list does not include the I-69 ORX project. The MPO is working with the ORX team to get that information. Once the ORX team is finished with their financial plan, the MPO can include that information in the TIP.

Projects are identified for the TIP through the Call for Projects. When a government agency is ready to move forward with financial commitment to a project under their jurisdiction, they would select a project from the MTP or another planning document such as safety, asset management, bicycle and pedestrian, or local capital improvement plan, and submit the project as part of the Call for Projects process. Once selected during the call, the project would then be programmed into the TIP.

The TIP will be available for public comment during the same timeframe as the MTP and will be available at the open house events.

Nate Hahn asked what the Technical Committee could do to assist the MPO with this process. Pam answered that reviewing the program of projects and providing input and asking questions will be a help.

Matt Schriefer provided an update on the 2023-2027 Coordinated Public Transit-Human Services Transportation Plan that is being updated along with the MTP and TIP. This plan looks at the transportation needs of seniors and individuals with disabilities through the Section 5310 Program. Within the next week, a draft document will be sent to the committee for review. The plan will be available for public comment during the same timeframe as the MTP and TIP and will be available at the open house events.

The Draft 2024-2028 TIP was advertised for a public comment period from January 25 through February 24, 2023. No comments on the TIP document were received. Changes in the text to expand discussion on public outreach were made per recommendations by FHWA and INDOT. After further discussion with INDOT, the draft TIP Program of Projects as presented during the Public Comment period should move forward for approval by the committees.

The TIP program of projects is fiscally constrained and the projects included in the TIP are consistent with the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) 2050 and air quality conformity determination report. The updated document is available on the Evansville MPO website.

These goals and accomplishments include completed and upcoming trainings and workshops, updates to Title VI documents and surveys, and the total number of Title VI complaints from the previous year.

EVANSVILLE MPO 2022/2023 TITLE VI ANNUAL GOALS AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS REPORT

2022 Title VI Accomplishments

- On March 10, 2022, the 2021/2022 Title VI Annual Goals and Accomplishments Report was presented to the MPO Technical Committee and Policy Board. The report was then added to the appendices of the Title VI Implementation Plan.
- On February 8, 2022, the MPO submitted the Title VI Goals and Accomplishments Report and the updated Title VI Implementation Plan to the KYTC Office for Civil Rights and Small Business Development.
- On March 22, 2022, the MPO submitted a final version of the Title VI Implementation Plan to the KYTC Office of Civil Rights based on their recommended modifications.
- On March 29, 2022, Tiffany Squire and Mikeal Watson from the KYTC Office of Civil Rights came to the Evansville MPO office for an on-site visit to discuss the MPO's Title VI Plan and other Title VI efforts.
- On March 30, 2022, the MPO received the Title VI approval letter from the KTYC Office of Civil Rights. After approval, the Title VI Implementation Plan was updated on the MPO website on the Publications & Links page under Civil Rights.
- From January to July, the MPO worked on a full update to the Title VI Implementation Plan and Limited English Proficiency Plan, with new demographic data, charts, and maps using the most current ACS Census data.
- On July 14, 2022, the MPO Policy Board adopted the updated Title VI Implementation Plan and Limited English Proficiency Plan.
- In June, the MPO was notified by the KYTC Office of Civil Rights that all MPOs needed to complete a Title II self-evaluation and transition plan. On September 8, the MPO sent a completed Title II self-evaluation and transition plan to the Office of Civil Rights, which was approved by the Office of Civil Rights on September 20.
- On September 29, 2022, the MPO Title VI & ADA Coordinator Matt Schriefer provided a Title VI pre-training guide to MPO staff to help prepare for the Title VI & ADA Training.
- On October 3, 2022, MPO Title VI & ADA Coordinator Matt Schriefer provided Title VI and ADA training to other MPO staff. The training included a game show to test staff's knowledge of Title VI and ADA requirements and a general discussion about potential Title VI and ADA issues and concerns.
- On October 19, 2022, the MPO Title VI & ADA Coordinator and MPO Deputy Director virtually attended Title VI training presented by the KYTC Office of Civil Rights as part of the Statewide Transportation Planning meeting.
- On January 24, April 25, and October 17, 2022, the MPO hosted the Regional Transit Advisory Committee (RTAC) meetings. The RTAC was formed in October 2018, with its first meeting on October 15, 2018. During the RTAC meetings, members discuss ways to improve transportation options in the region for all residents. Members include public, private, and non-profit transportation providers in the five county MPO region.
- The MPO Title VI & ADA Coordinator continued to meet periodically with the National Center for Mobility Management, Shared-Use Mobility Center, and Health By Design to discuss mobility management across the country and state of Indiana.
- The MPO attended Talent EVV meetings hosted by the Welborn Baptist Foundation and will continue to work with them to improve transportation options to healthcare appointments and work in the five county region.
- The MPO worked with METS and the Toyota Mobility Foundation to discuss the potential for an additional transit option for seniors, individuals with a disability, and low income individuals in Evansville.
- There were <u>0</u> Title VI or ADA complaints against the MPO in 2022.

2023 Title VI Goals

- Provide 2022/2023 Title VI Goals and Accomplishments to INDOT and KYTC.
- Have Title VI/ADA Coordinator attend at least one in-person or online training. Encourage other staff members to attend online training opportunities.
- Have Title VI/ADA Coordinator complete Title VI and ADA training to MPO staff members. Coordinator will have staff sign Notification to the Public of Rights under Title VI.
- Continue to host Regional Transit Advisory Committee (RTAC) meetings quarterly.
- Continue to participate in Indiana Mobility Management Strategic Planning.
- Continue to participate in planning efforts with METS and HART to increase transit options for seniors, individuals with a disability, and low income individuals in Evansville and Henderson.
- Strive for <u>O</u> Title VI or ADA complaints against the MPO in 2023. If there is a complaint, consult with complainant to determine the best possible solution moving forward.

METS and HART have been required to develop annual Transit Asset Management (TAM) Targets since completion of the Group TAM Plan in September 2018. At the end of each year, the MPO gathers fleet data from METS and HART to calculate the end of the previous year Performance Metrics and set the end of the current year Targets. Although not required, the MPO also calculates Performance Metrics and sets Targets for the non-profit vehicles. With your approval of these Targets, the MPO will include them in the TIP and MTP documents. The table on the back of this memo includes TAM Performance Measure definitions, end of 2022 Performance Metrics, and end of 2023 TAM Targets.

Starting in 2021, METS and HART are also required to develop annual Safety Targets. These Targets are listed in the Public Transit Agency Safety Plans (PTASP) for both METS and HART.
